Young (or Old), Restless and Reformed? Today we are hearing a buzz about "Reformed."

Have you ever wondered what Church is like as done among the Reformed Tradition? The Reformed tradition does not seek to be edgy, cool or sexy. Instead, it's aim is to call sinners unto God through Jesus Christ alone for salvation, by faith alone, through grace alone to live to the glory of God. The emphasis is to call men, women and children to a life of humble devotion before the face of the Holy, Triune God.

We want to introduce you to the Spirit of the Reformation. It is alive and well.

The Reformed tradition is what churches were like before the world of fads and innovations.

There is a difference between being "Old" and being "Timeless." While the Reformed tradition is now old (it was a movement by the Spirit of God that took shape and form in the 16th century); more importantly, it is timeless. Why? Because it is based on the unchanging, infallible, inerrant, inspired Word of God.

The Reformed tradition is much more than Five Points of Calvinism. The Reformed tradition is nothing less than the faithful exposition/explanation of the History of God's Redeeming work as revealed in the Scriptures. It's central purpose is to set forth and proclaim the Glory of God, the faithful worship of God, and life in fellowship with God. Or as one modern Reformed theologian has called it: Reformed Theology, Piety and Practice.

The Reformed tradition is not undefined. Rather, it is laid out in faithful, time tested summaries of God's Word in our confessions: The Heidelberg Catechism, the Canons of Dort, and the Belgic Confession. These confessions are used by Reformed Churches to make disciples of children and adults. So that by sound doctrine we might rightly know God, heartily love Him, worship Him as the Scripture teaches us to Worship, and live with him in eternal blessedness to praise and glorify Him.

The Reformed confessions explain such crucial and central truths as: The Covenant of Works, the Covenant of Grace, the Law and the Gospel, the right use of the Sacraments-Baptism and the Lord's Supper, Regeneration, Conversion, Justification by Faith alone, Sanctification, The Church and its God ordained government, Church Discipline, Prayer, Worship as defined and regulated by God alone, Heaven and Hell, and much, much more. Central to all of these teachings is the majesty of God, and the gift of His Son Jesus Christ; and how He graciously and freely gives us all things through His life, perfect obedience, suffering, death, resurrection, ascension, and His coming again in final judgement of all things.
